Reading	Choose a book and search for the letter "Aa" on each page. Use your star catcher to trap them.	Fine Motor/Writing	Cut out pictures from a magazine or catalog and glue on paper.	Math	Count objects into groups of 10. Count aloud every time you put a group together.	Speaking	Think of words that begin with the same letter sound. (ex sand, sock, seed, super)
Reading	Cut Straws! Cut up a few straws then use their pieces to make the letters of the alphabet.	Fine Motor/Writing	Give your child some playdoh and have them roll it out like a snake. Then have them use child-safe scissors to cut it into small pieces.	Math	Search around your home and see if you can find 5 things shaped like a circle.	Speaking	Sequence an event that happens during your day. Ex: eating breakfast- get a bowl and spoon, get the cereal box and milk. Pour the cereal into a bowl, pour the milk, and eat.
Reading	Choose a book and read the book with a silly voice.	Fine Motor/Writing	Rainbow writing: write letters in yellow crayon then traces with different colors of the rainbow 3 or more colors.	Math	Count how many spoons/forks you have. Which one has the most? Least? Same?	Gross Motor	Letter musical chairs. Write letters on sticky notes and place on a chair. Play the music and when it stops say the letter you sit on.
Reading	Get your letter "Aa" book. Go through the pages and do the activities for the letter A.	Fine Motor/Writing	Tear paper and make a picture and then write a story about it.	Math	Get your Number 1 book. Go through the pages and do the activities.	Gross Motor	Color/Rainbow Walk. Take a walk around your back yard or on a nature trail and look for different colors.

Reading

Sing the alphabet song with your child. Read a book together and see if you can find and point to each letter of the alphabet in the book.

Fine Motor/Writing

"If I were invisible like a ghost I would...."
Tell your answer aloud along with an illustration.

Math

Get your Number 5 book. Go through the pages and do the different activities.

Speaking

Say a word. See how many words you can think of that start with the same sound as that word. Repeat 3 times. (ie ghost, witch, zombie, pumpkin)

Reading

Read a Halloween book in your costume.

Fine Motor/Writing

Draw pumpkins on a big sheet of paper & write letters inside each pumpkin. Call out the name/sound of a letter, and have your little one color in that pumpkin.

Math

Use small snack food to make patterns. Then eat them!

Speaking

Let's discuss! What is the difference between being a good friend and a bad friend? What are some examples?

Reading

Get your letter "O" book. Go through the pages and do the activities.

Fine Motor/Writing

Make a movement pattern using claps, stomps, any other action movements. See if others can follow it.

Math

Roll a ball. Count how many steps it rolls to measure. Record the number. Repeat 5 times. Circle the roll with the most steps.

Gross Motor

Gather objects that can get wet. Fill the sink or tub with water. See which objects sink and which will float.

Reading

Read a book to your child. Have them draw a picture of a character from the story.

Fine Motor/Writing

Find out what different things you can make from pumpkins. Draw a picture of different foods that can be made from pumpkins.

Math

Get a deck of cards. Play Hi-Lo (game of war). *Your child and a partner take turns flipping over a card. Decide who has the lower/higher card.

Gross Motor

Carve a pumpkin. Paint a face on it. Make pumpkin seeds.

Reading

Turn off the lights. Grab a flashlight and read a book in the dark.

Fine Motor/Writing

Let's observe! Rub your hands quickly together to make heat. Hold an ice cube and see how long it takes to melt.

Math

Get your Number 4 book. Go through the pages and do the different activities.

Speaking

Let's rhyme! Listen to the word pairs. Give a thumbs up if they rhyme:
jet/pet; pig/dig;
bad/big; man/van; hop/hip; fin/pin.

Reading

Look at a book's pictures. Tell the story only by doing a picture walk and only looking at the pictures shown.

Fine Motor/Writing

Let's draw! Draw a picture of different items you can smell. Put a smile next to items you think will smell good. Put a frown next to items you think will smell bad.

Math

Count back and forth to 5. You need a partner. Beginning with 1, take turns, naming the next number. Can you count down from 5?

Speaking

Let's sing!
Sing the alphabet song. Sing it in a regular voice. Sing it in a baby voice. Sing it in a monster voice. Sing it in a robot voice.

Reading

Get your letter "Pp" book. Go through the pages and do the activities.

Fine Motor/Writing

Let's build! With a helper, collect sticks, flowers, or leaves. Use these objects to build your name letter-by-letter.

Math

Let's compare! Collect 10 items and put them in a bag. Take two items out and compare them. Which item is bigger, and which is smaller? Longer? Shorter?

Gross Motor

Create the letter A with your body! Stand with feet apart. Place your arms overhead with palms together.
Chant
/a/, /a/, A!

Reading

Find a book with the letter "Pp" in the title and read it with an adult.

Fine Motor/Writing

Squeeze a lemon or orange and see how much juice you can get from it.

Math

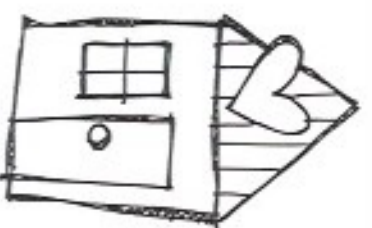
Let's play! Write down the numbers 0-5 on a piece of paper. Say, "Rock, paper, numbers." Then show 0-5 fingers. Count the total fingers and point to the number on the paper.

Gross Motor

Let's play catch! Grab a ball, stuffed animal, or bean bag and play catch with a friend or an adult. See how many times you can catch it before it drops!

Reading

Write your first name 3 times.

*Challenge: read the letters back to someone; Adult- point to random letters and ask to say it's name

Fine Motor/Writing

If you were playing in the snow, what would you be doing? Tell someone about your picture.

Math

Make a pattern with 2 objects. This could be done with coins, different types of cereal, buttons, etc. (raisin, peanut, raisin, peanut, etc)

Speaking

Let's discuss!
What is the difference between being a good friend and a bad friend?
What are some examples?

Reading

Read a book with your stuffed animals.

Fine Motor/Writing

Practice zipping your coat.

Math

Search around your home and see if you can find 5 things shaped like a triangle.

Speaking

Sing "5 Little Monkeys" and "8-I-N-G-O" to your family.

Reading

Read a book with an adult. Talk about your favorite part.

Fine Motor/Writing

Trace around your hand with a pencil. Then trace around it with your favorite color.

Math

Count how many boxes you can find in your house.

Gross Motor

Let's color tap! Have an adult call out a color. You will run through the house and tap as many items as you can that are the color.

Reading

Have someone write the letters of your name on small pieces of paper and put them around the house. Go find them and spell your name.

Fine Motor/Writing

When I Grow Up- Help your child think of a list of jobs. Then have them draw a picture of what they want to be when they grow up.

Math

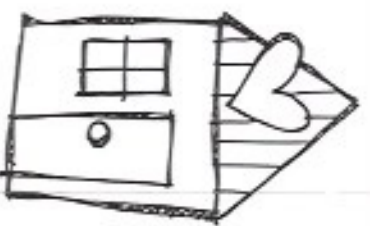

Gross Motor

Reading

Fine Motor/Writing

Let's make our name!
Build the letters in your name using a favorite snack (pretzels, cereal, goldfish).

Math

Search around your home and see if you can find 5 things shaped like a rectangle.

Speaking

Let's rhyme!
Listen to the word pairs. Give a thumbs up if they rhyme: **jam/ham; sip/dip; bag/bin; can/fan; top/lip; pat/cat.**

Reading

Get your letter "Tt" book. Go through the pages and do the activities.

Fine Motor/Writing

Stack small wooden blocks or legos into the tallest tower you can make.

Math

Let's draw!
Write the numbers 1-5. Draw the correct amount of dots to match each number.

Gross Motor

Let's walk!
Go on a walk around your neighborhood with someone special! Play "I spy" as you walk around your neighborhood.

Reading

Pick a book. Make a stage and read to an audience.

Fine Motor/Writing

Write the letters in your name all scrambled up (out of order). Then tell an adult the letters and sounds in the order you wrote them.

Math

Let's create!
Using sidewalk chalk (or crayon), make a house. Remember a house is made up of a triangle and a square. Use as many shapes as you can.

Gross Motor

Let's pretend! Stand on one leg. Bend your other leg at the knee and place your foot on your inner thigh. Sway back and forth like a mighty tree! Switch legs.
