We are using a computer program in the classroom called Freckle. With Freckle, you will be able to practice at your own ability level! You need to practice **at least 300 minutes** during the summer. The due date is Tuesday, September 2nd. It might be helpful to keep a log of your minutes as you work. You do not need to submit the log. I receive reports weekly. Feel free to practice as many skills and as often as you would like.

**PLEASE NOTE: YOU WILL NEED A COMPUTER WITH INTERNET ACCESS. PLEASE VISIT THE LOCAL PUBLIC LIBRARY IF YOU DO NOT HAVE ACCESS AT HOME.**

You and your child can access the program in a couple ways:

1. Access the program online at [freckle.com](http://freckle.com) using Google Chrome as your browser, selecting “Student sign in” at the top of the page. OR 2. Access the program on an iPad with the free app: [freckle.com/app](http://freckle.com/app). Your child will login using their first and last name as well as our class code:

Once logged in, it is important that this practice is done independently, without any help at home. If students are having difficulty with a concept, and the video tutorials on the site do not help, your child may either stop or go on to another section. I want the information that I gather from Freckle to be a true picture of your child’s Math skills. Thank you for supporting your child’s education at home.
