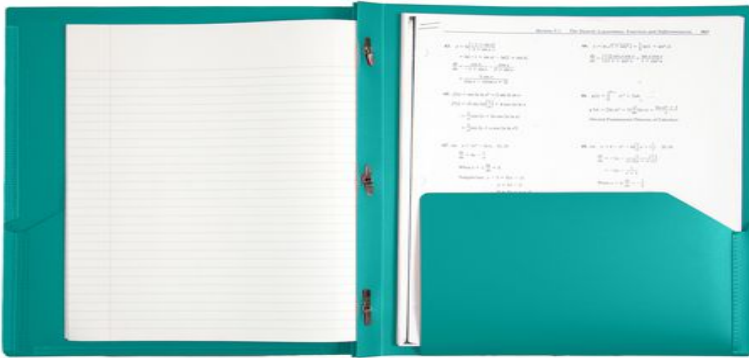

Person of the Year

You will become journalists for a famous news magazine. The assignment is to select a "Person of the Year" for the next issue. As journalists, you need to convince your editor-in-chief that the person they have selected is deserving of this title. Students write a brief article that explains their choice based on research. You will also design a magazine cover honoring this person. When we return to school you will present your project with an oral presentation and then take a class vote to decide which person they learned about is deserving of the title "Most Outstanding Person of the Year." **Choose a historical person that you believe should have received this honor from any point related to American History.**

1 page essay, cover page for the magazine (not a computer image, make a drawing of them or maybe their contribution to history) and a 1-2 minute presentation.

These will be presented the first week of school. Be ready!
